Call for Proposals

The DLM Forum Foundation is calling upon DLM members and nonmembers - professionals, scholars, and industry - in the fields of public administration, ICT, records and archives management for the submission of proposals for papers to be presented at the 5th Triennial Conference, 12-14 December 2011, in Brussels. The conference will present and discuss the latest developments in electronic records and archives management, including up-to-date industry news and inside information on MoReq2010®.

Themes

The theme of the conference is **Interoperability & MoReq2010®. Making intelligent information control a reality in Europe.**

Interoperability is essential to the management of records. Today's organisations typically refresh their technology every three to five years. Records are often held for much longer than that. If an organisation is required to keep a particular record for 75 years then, at the end of that period, it will typically have been transferred from one records system to another between 15 and 25 times.

The European Commission strongly believes that action on interoperability is essential to maximise the social and economic potential of information and communication technologies.

A significant objective of MoReq2010® is to facilitate interoperability between compliant records systems.

The programme will include keynote lectures, papers, presentations and workshops by Europe's leading authorities on archives, records and information management, focusing on:

- Interoperability and standards
- MoReq2010® present and future
- Applying records management in structured information systems (ERP etc)
- Think small: records management for small and medium enterprises (SME)
- Sustainability: implementing a sustainable records management programme
- e-government and e-business
- Re-use of government data and information
- Freedom of information, access to archives

- Open source
- Information management in the cloud
- Sharing infrastructures and services
- Educating users, fostering a corporate culture of good practice around records and information, raising awareness of information governance requirements
- Long-term preservation and access

These issues will constitute the core of the programme, to be discussed in two plenary sessions, six parallel sessions and a number of workshops and round tables. Presentations at parallel sessions are limited to 20 minutes.

At the plenary sessions, simultaneous interpretation to and from Dutch, French, German and English will be provided. At the parallel sessions interpretation will be provided only to English (from Dutch, French and German).

Submission of proposals

- Proposals of papers, presentations, workshops etc. should consist of an abstract (900 characters, including spaces)
- Proposals must be in English
- Submissions must include the name(s) and short CVs of the authors with current organization and role, full addresses including an e-mail address
- Each submission will be examined on the basis of its clarity, quality and adherence to the main topics of the conference
- Notification on the result of the selection will be given to submitters by 15 October 2011
